Authority Issues Hang Up The Telephone Pastor Eric Nelson


Community Group Questions:

- 1. Let's play a quick round of "Telephone" as a group. What changed between the original message and the final one—and what do you think this game illustrates about how people view the Bible today?
- 2. If someone told you the Bible was just a collection of bad translations of copies of copies, how would you naturally respond?(Be honest—have you ever wondered that yourself?)
- 3. Digging Deeper: How does learning about the sheer number of manuscripts and the short time gap between the original writings and the earliest copies change your perception of the Bible's reliability? (Does that evidence surprise you? Encourage you? Leave you with more questions?)
- 4. The Variant Challenge: What do you make of the idea that more manuscript variations actually strengthen our confidence in the New Testament's accuracy rather than weaken it? (Why would a scribe's accidental mistakes—or attempts to "help"—not be a deal-breaker?)
- 5. If the Bible has been transmitted accurately, how should that affect the way we approach it as an authority in our lives? (Does that change how you read it, apply it, or even defend it in conversation?)

REALITY: No original documents of the Bible **EXIST.**

REALITY CHECK: Even though we don't have any originals, we can **CONFIDENTLY** know what the originals said.

TRANSMISSION: Can we be confident that the original text of the Bible was transmitted accurately to us through the centuries?



For the New Testament the evidence is overwhelming. There are 5,366 manuscripts to compare and draw information from and some of these date from the 2nd and 3rd centuries. To put that into perspective, there are only 643 copies of Homer's Iliad and that is the most famous book of Ancient Greece. No one doubts the existence of Julius Caesar's Gallic Wars, but we only have 10 copies of it and the earliest was made 1,000 years after it was written. To have such an abundance of copies of the New Testament from dates within 70 years after their writings is amazing. Norman Geisler

Not only do we not have the originals, we don't have the first copies of the originals. We don't even have copies of the originals, or copies of the copies of the copies of the originals. What we have are copies made later—much later. In most instances, they are copies made many centuries later. And these copies all differ from one another, in many thousands of places….these copies differ from one another in so many places that we don't even know how many differences there are. Possibly it is easiest to put it in comparative terms: there are more differences among our manuscripts than there are words in the New Testament. Barth Ehrman
