

Quiet Quitting Christians Questions Jesus Asked Pt. 3

Small Group Questions:

1. How has the great resignation impacted you or your workplace environment?
2. What is quiet quitting and how does it relate to following Jesus?
3. Read John 6:25-67. What observations can you make about why these people quit following Jesus?
4. Think about the 3 human desires above. How do each of these connect to the metaphor of bread in Jesus' teaching about himself?
5. Is there something that would cause you to stop following Jesus? What? Hypothetically, where else would you go?
6. Even when it's difficult, according to Peter, why should we continue to follow Jesus? Pray that Peter's reasons for following would be your reasons too.

Quiet Quitting: *the bare minimum commitment to still receive benefits.*

RELIGIOUS people have a reputation for the bare minimum commitment to still receive the benefits.

Am I a quiet quitting Christian?

Does this offend you?

You do not want to leave too, do you?

John 6:25-27 *When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" 26 Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. 27 Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval."*



John 6:28-33 Then they asked him, "What must we do to do the works God requires?" **29** Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent." **30** So they asked him, "What sign then will you give that we may see it and believe you? What will you do?" **31** Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written: 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'" **32** Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. **33** For the bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

John 6:34-36 "Sir," they said, "always give us this bread." **35** Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. **36** But as I told you, you have seen me and still you do not believe.

3 Human Desires:

1. Security
2. Significance
3. Satisfaction

KEY TRUTH: Jesus doesn't give us what we desire rather He is our **DESIRE**.

John 6:53-67 Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. **54** Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. **55** For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. **56** Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. **57** Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. **58** This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live forever." **59** He said this while teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum. **60** On hearing it, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?" **61** Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this, Jesus said to them, "**Does this offend you? ...** **66** From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. **67** "**You do not want to leave too, do you?**" Jesus asked the Twelve.

Don't feed your sinful appetite, feed on the sinner's **SUBSTITUTE**.

When Jesus challenges our hearts we have 3 options...

1. Desertion
2. Rejection
3. Submission

John 6:68-69 Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. **69** We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

BOTTOM LINE: If you don't see Jesus as The Holy One of God you will **LEAVE** Him eventually.
